Module 30, Overview of The Fertilising Products Regulation (FPR)

This course provides participants with an overview of the EU Fertilising Products Regulation (FPR) (Regulation 2019/1009). At the end of this course participants will have a thorough understanding of the practical implications for EU manufacturers and importers of fertilising products and how the FPR applies to their own area of work.

In particular participants will:

- understand the background and fundamentals of the FPR
- understand the terminology and definitions, and how fertilising products are defined in terms of Product Function Categories (PFCs) and Component Material Categories (CMCs)
- understand the obligations of suppliers of fertilising products across the EU
- understand the process for CE marking and conformity assessment procedures covering key steps involved, timelines and expected costs
- understand the structure and data requirements for a submission for conformity assessment depending on the PFC
- understanding the transition period after the new FPR came into place
- have a list of resources available with respect to the FPR

Who Should Attend?

This module is designed for a wide audience of those involved in or responsible for marketing fertilisers in the EU, and in particular:

- new recruits into the field of fertilising products and plant biostimulants regulatory affairs
- technical or scientific staff in companies that manufacture, import or supply fertilising products and plant biostimulants for use in the EU
- managers of regulatory departments in companies marketing fertilisers and plant biostimulants
